## **INSTRUCTIONS**

The "date of approval" of the lot split is the date that all standard conditions of approval are met and the Parcel Map is approved for recording.

If the owner of the subject property is an entity or entities other than a natural person, it is the applicant's responsibility to submit appropriate documentation to demonstrate ownership and persons legally authorized to approve real estate transactions. When necessary for entities, please attach a separate sheet(s) using the appropriate entity signature block(s).

An applicant is not required to sign this affidavit if the applicant is a "community land trust," as defined in clause (ii) of subparagraph (C) of paragraph (11) of subdivision (a) of Section 402.1 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, or is a "qualified nonprofit corporation" as described in Section 214.15 of the Revenue and Taxation Code. An applicant must provide documentation to support its status as a community land trust or qualified nonprofit corporation in order to claim one of these exemptions from the affidavit requirement.
